Registration

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How can I find out which camps are available?

The YPW ticketing system will indicate which camps are available. If a camp date is not listed, it has been filled. For further information, please call at 512-329-5611 We do offer a waiting list.

Can you accommodate my child with special needs?

We are happy to accommodate children with special needs but we ask that you notify us of your child's needs prior to your child's first day of camp. Please help us help your child by notifying us of any allergies, accessibility concerns, behavioral, psychological or emotional conditions, or other special needs. Please call 512.329.5611 to speak with the Camp Manager.

While we hope to offer these camps to as wide a range of children as possible, it is not possible for us to offer one-on-one care. In the case of severe food allergies, it is not possible for us to monitor the food other children bring into camp.

YPW is NOT responsible for administering medication to children. Consult a pediatrician about altering the child's dosage so that medication can be administered outside of camp hours.

What are the qualifications of your teachers and assistants?

All of our teachers are certified school teachers or highly trained professionals with extensive experience in their respective fields. They all have experience working with children and enjoy hands-on interactive activities.

How are campers supervised?

Campers are supervised at all times. For your child's security all campers MUST be escorted to and from their camp room by a parent or guardian and signed in and out EVERY DAY. We realize leaving your contact information each day may not always be convenient. In the event of an emergency, we want to have the most accurate contact information for you.

Frequently Asked Questions

May parents stay in the classroom?

No. If you feel that your child is unable to remain in camp without you for more than a few minutes, you probably should wait a year before you send him/her to camp. Our weeklong camps promote independent learning and socialization. Parents are not allowed to remain in the classroom during camp hours.

What are the behavior expectations for campers?

Camper expectations are posted in each room and are emphasized throughout the week. In case of a severe behavior problem, we will call you and ask you to pick up your child. At our discretion, your child may be allowed to return to camp the following day.

Whom may I contact during the day if I need to leave an emergency message concerning my child?

Please call YPW at 512-329-5611 and a staff member will deliver your message to the appropriate person.

Food & Drinks

Does my child need to bring a lunch? Yes. Campers are supervised in their camp room while they eat lunch.

Does my child need to bring snack?

Does my child need to bring drinking water to camp? Yes. Please make sure your camper brings a bottle of water everyday to camp.
